Education & Professional Experience

I entered the field of OT in 2013 after receiving my MSOT from Washington University in St. Louis. After several years working primarily in pediatrics, I transitioned to a rehab hospital and worked as the lead OTP on our pediatric inpatient unit as well as a senior OTP in our outpatient and day rehab program. I then went on to be the pediatric program coordinator at the hospital developing programming, developing written communications for internal and external audiences including brochures, annual department reports, and quarterly outcomes reporting. In this role I served as an advocate for the pediatric program to our corporate administrators and CEOs, improved awareness and understanding of our unique program, and worked closely with the leadership team on many projects. After receiving my post-professional OTD from Boston University in 2018, I pursued a career in academia and have been a full-time faculty at North Central College since 2019. I am currently the doctoral capstone coordinator for the program. I also created and maintain several social media accounts for the program including an alumni group, and main Instagram and Facebook profiles.

I have been an active member in ILOTA and AOTA since 2012, and founded the Pi Theta Epsilon chapter at North Central College. I am currently a co-faculty advisor for the Beta Sigma chapter for the 4th consecutive year. I am currently mentoring some of my entry level students to do the same. To date I have also mentored over 20 post-professional students to completion of their doctoral dissertation projects and continue in this mentorship role.
